## **History of Quinn's Tree Farm**

Cornville has always been known for it's Christmas Trees. Carleton Hodges came to Cornville in the early 1960's, and transformed the landscape of the West Ridge into Hodges' Tree Farm, with over 100 acres of Christmas Trees. A young Jeffrey Quinn had his first job in high school shearing trees for Mr. Hodges, and it instilled in him a love for horticulture and Christmas. Carleton even convinced Jeffrey to grow Christmas Trees on his 3 acres of Cornville homestead, where he had started his family with Susan, his bride.

Life took over, and the trees, while always there, were managed by other local farmers, providing a small income for the Quinn's, and keeping the land active and beautiful.

Fast forward to the fall of 2018, when Jeffrey and his grown son Matthew bought a tractor together. Matt toured the tree fields on said tractor and decided that they were on need of a lot of love and care. Much of the North Field had grown up into full sized trees, and many of the viable trees were in need of shearing. He convinced his father that it was time to take back the family fields, and Matt went to work starting a new business, The Cornville Christmas Tree Company, which operates Quinn's Tree Farm.

No trees were sold that year, there was just too much to do to get ready, but in 2019, after a year of shearing, mowing, and culling and burning over 500 overgrown trees from the fields, Quinn's Tree Farm was ready to make local family's holiday season more joyous with a real Cornville Balsam Fir!

In 2021, The Forest, another local Christmas Tree Farm was put up for sale. Quinn's Tree Farm made the leap from a three acre side project to owning and managing 25 acres of Christmas Trees.

#### **Farm Tour**

On Sunday, we will return to the farm for a shearing demonstration by my father Jeff. He will show everyone how he uses shears to shape trees, as he hates using knives.

I will have all of my equipment on display. This will include what I have found to be essential, my flail mower, grapple bucket, and battery backpack sprayer.

The fields will be open for wandering, and guided tours. People will be able to see trees that had been sheared aggressively in 2021 and what they look like now.

We can work to identify the different species I have on the farm, some of them even baffle me. I know I have Balsam, Korean, and Frasers.

I would like to show people the Ass Over Treekettle Field. This is next to my sisters Bloody Mary Mix kitchen, where I planted 500 MCTA seedlings in 2020.

There is a good chance I will have a "Yard Sale" table up, of items that I do not need that could go to a good home.
